



Construction Focus Four

The actual breakdown of the causes of fatalities on construction sites in 2019 is as follows (numbers are a percentage of the 1,061 total construction-related fatalities that occurred in 2019):

- Falls: 418 (39.3%)
- Struck-by: 90 (8.4%)
- Electrocutions: 79 (7.4%)
- Caught-in/between: 59 (5.5%)

Opioids in the Workplace

- Workers in occupations at higher risk for injury and illness such as construction -- are more likely to:
 - Obtain opioid prescriptions.
 - Die from an opioid overdose
- Construction industry has one of the highest injury rates.
- Opioids are commonly prescribed to construction workers.





Women in Construction



 As of Dec. 31, 2018, approximately 1,106,919 women were employed in various occupation sectors of the construction industry

 Women now make up 9.9 percent of the construction industry in the United States.

The number of women employed in the U.S. construction industry grew substantially by 81.3% from 1985 to 2007; however, due to a loss of over 2.5 million construction

illustrated below in Table I (1), and since its peak in 2007, more than 300,000 women

workers left the construction industry by 2010. While only 9% of U.S. construction workers are women, which is a relatively small percentage compared to other industries (see Table II ⁽²⁾ below), there were still over 800.000 women workers


