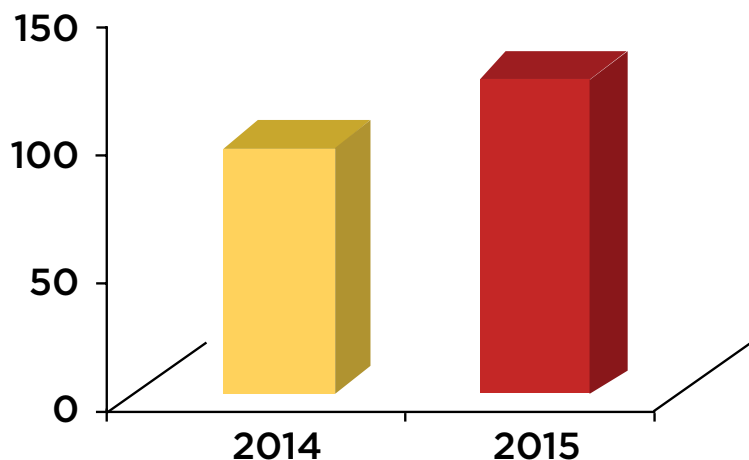


# FATAL FALLS
