Remember This

- Keep steps and walking surfaces clear of mud, snow, grease, and fluids to prevent slips and falls when climbing on or off equipment.
- Use hand and step holds keep one foot and two hands, or both feet and one hand, in contact with the equipment at all times.
- > Do not try to jump off the equipment.
- Avoid carrying materials or tools when climbing on or off equipment.
- Wear appropriate footwear.
