




Why a National Stand-Down?

STRUCK-BY OBJECT OR EQUIPMENT FATALITIES




STRUCK-BY OBJECT OR EQUIPMENT NON-FATAL INJURIES



Construction vs All Industries Combined

- Construction makes up less than 6% of the U.S.
 Workforce.
- It accounts for about 12% of the struck-by injuries and 17% of the <u>fatalities</u>.




Construction Sectors

- The Highway, Street and Bridge sector has the most fatalities.
- The Plumbing, Heating and Air Conditioning subsector has the most injuries.
- The Masonry subsector has the highest rate of injuries.



Struck-by Vehicles

- Between 2011-2018, there were 4,980 non-fatal injuries in construction.
- During the same period there were 502 fatal injuries.
- In 2018, construction accounted for 20% of struck-by vehicle fatalities.

Industry Perceptions of Struck-by Incidents




Purpose of Survey

- Inform the development of new resources and strategies to protect workers by reducing struck-by hazards



Who they work for...




Segment of the industry worked in most frequently















Primary Causes of Struck-by Incidents



Biggest Barriers to Preventing Struck-by Incidents


